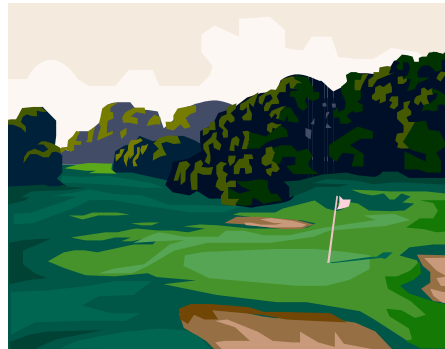
You may also wish to do some research, using the internet, on blogs in general. There are also numerous books on the subject of writing them.
